Mireille Silcoff is the author of the story collection *Chez L'arabe*, which was named one of the best books of 2014 by the *Globe & Mail*, CBC Books, *Canadian Notes & Queries*, the *Montreal Gazette*, The *Walrus*, and others. Chez L'arabe won the Canadian Jewish Literary Award for Short Story, took second prize for the Danuta Gleed Award, was long-listed for the Frank O'Connor International Short Story Prize, shortlisted for the Vine Award for Canadian Jewish Literature, and was voted Canada's favourite work of short fiction on CBC's Canada Writes. Mireille has been a longtime weekend columnist with the *National Post*. She is also a contributor to the *New York Times Magazine*, The Guardian, and other publications, the author of two books about recreational drug culture, and the founding editor New York-based Jewish literary quarterly *Guilt & Pleasure*. Mireille lives in Montreal. She is currently writing her first novel.
