A professional member of the Canadian Authors Association and the Federation of British Columbia Writers, Nina Shoroplova has published six books, a number of articles, and a handful of poetry.

Nina's most recent book is the best-selling *Legacy of Trees: Purposeful Wandering in Vancouver's Stanley Park* (Heritage House, 2020), a finalist in the 2020 BC Lieutenant Governor's Historical Writing Awards.

The best-selling history *Cattle Ranch: The Story of Douglas Lake Cattle Company* by Nina G. Woolliams (Douglas & McIntyre, 1979) was her first book.

Between *Legacy of Trees* and *Cattle Ranch*, Nina has self-published four books:

- *Trust the Mystery: Choosing to Engage with Life with Wonder, Joy, and Awe*
- *Spiraling Self-Awareness: Personal Mission Revealed in 27 Days*
- *EMPOWER Your Inner Author: You Can Write a Book*
- *You've Written Your Book: Next Steps*

Nina has tried her hand at a wide gamut of writing: poetry, music hall scripts, Christmas pageants, plays and stories for children, emcee patter, theatrical reviews, family history, and blog posts.

"Sombreness Sunlit" published in *The Group of Seven Reimagined: Contemporary Stories Inspired by Historic Canadian Paintings* is her first flash fiction piece and she enjoyed the challenge. Intriguingly, Emily Carr called to Nina across the veil, resulting in the beginning of a play about Emily's life, "My Beloved West," which now languishes unfinished in Nina's filing cabinet.
